TRANSFER ADMISSION STANDARDS

ADMISSIONS.TXST.EDU/TRANSFER

If you have completed transferable credit hours after high school graduation, you are considered a transfer student. You must submit official transcripts from every college and/or university you have attended before the priority date of the semester to which you are applying. Test credits (AP, IB, CLEP) are not considered for transfer admission purposes. You must be eligible to return to all previous institutions regardless of GPA or degrees received (e.g., free of suspensions, dismissal, or enforced withdrawal).

To receive assured admission as a transfer student, you must meet the following minimum requirements at the time of application.

TRANSFERABLE CREDIT HOURS	ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS
15 or fewer hours	2.0 cumulative GPA Meet freshman admission standards
16-29 hours	2.5 cumulative GPA
30+ hours	2.25 cumulative GPA

Review

If you do not meet assured admission requirements but have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0, your application will be reviewed through our holistic review process.



Transfer Scholarships

Assured Scholarships

Awarded automatically to all students admitted to Texas State as a first-time transfer to the university with at least 30 transferable hours from a community college or 4-year college/ university and a minimum 3.25 cumulative GPA. Specific qualifications can be found on our website.

Texas State's Annual Security Reports and Fire Safety Report

We value the safety of all members of the Texas State University community at our main campus in San Marcos, TX and separate campuses in Maxwell, TX (ALERRT Campus) and Round Rock, TX. Texas State publishes a combined Annual Security and Fire Safety Report that contains information regarding campus safety and security including topics such as: campus law enforcement authority; crime reporting policies; campus alerts (Timely Warnings and Emergency Notifications); fire safety policies and procedures; programs to prevent dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault and stalking; the procedures the University will follow when one of these crimes is reported; and other matters of importance related to security on campus. The report also contains information about crime statistics for the three most recent calendar years concerning reported crimes that occurred on campus; in on-campus student housing facilities; in noncampus buildings or property owned or controlled by the University or a recognized student organization; and on public property within, or immediately adjacent to and accessible from, the campus. The report also provides fire statistics for any fires occurring in an on-campus student housing facility during the three most recent calendar years. The Fire Safety Report section and on-campus student housing statistics do not apply to Round Rock or the ALERRT Center, as those campuses do not currently have any student housing facilities.
