



Recommended Curriculum

We recommend the following curriculum or its equivalent for admission. Students applying without this curriculum will go through our review process.

English (four credits) | English I, II, III, IV

Math (four credits) | Algebra I and II, Geometry, Advanced Math

Science (four credits) | Biology, Chemistry and two advanced sciences such as Physics, Environmental Science, Anatomy and Physiology, or Integrated Physics and Chemistry

Social Studies (three credits) | World/ Human Geography or World History, U.S. History since 1877, U.S. Government (half credit), Economics (half credit)

Foreign Language (two credits)

Review

Applicants ranked in the top 75% of their class who do not meet assured admission requirements will be reviewed through our holistic review process. For more information, visit admissions.txst.edu/review.

Transfer Admission Standards

ADMISSIONS.TXST.EDU/TRANSFER

If you have completed transferable credit hours after graduating from high school, you are a transfer student. Official transcripts from every college and/or university you have attended must be submitted prior to the priority date of the semester to which you are applying. Test credits (AP, IB, CLEP) are not considered for transfer admission purposes.

You must be eligible to return to all previous institutions regardless of GPA or degrees received (e.g., free of suspensions, dismissal, or enforced withdrawal).

To receive assured admission as a transfer student, you must meet the following minimum requirements at the time of application.

TRANSFERABLE CREDIT HOURS	ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS
15 or fewer hours	2.0 cumulative GPA Meet freshman admission standards
16-29 hours	2.5 cumulative GPA
30+ hours	2.25 cumulative GPA

Review

If you do not meet assured admission requirements but have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0, your application will be reviewed through our holistic review process.

2. Submit the application fee of \$75 (nonrefundable). **Fee waivers are available to students who qualify.**
3. Send your high school transcript or GED certificate.
4. Send official college transcripts, if applicable.
5. Send your SAT/ACT scores.
Texas State codes: ACT 4178; SAT 6667
*Applicants for the spring, summer, and fall 2023 terms may be reviewed without standardized test scores.
6. (Optional) Submit an essay using the prompts (see admissions.txst.edu/future-students/admission-essay for details).

Transfer

1. Complete your transfer application (see admissions.txst.edu/apply for details).
2. Submit the application fee of \$75 (nonrefundable). **Fee waivers are available to students who qualify.**
3. Submit official college/university transcripts from all schools attended.
4. Send your high school transcript or GED certificate.

After an initial review, some applicants may be asked to submit additional information.

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Program-Specific Requirements for Freshmen and Transfer Students

To apply for financial aid, students must complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) at studentaid.gov/fafsa. The earlier you complete the FAFSA, the more likely you are to receive the best financial aid possible.

Assured Scholarships

Awarded automatically to students ranked in the top 35% of their graduating class (or completing the IB Diploma or AP Capstone Diploma) and meeting SAT/ACT score minimums*. Specific qualifications can be found on our website.

Example:

President's Honor Scholarship: \$48,000 over four years

Texas State Achievement Scholarship:

\$24,000–\$32,000 over four years

Texas State Distinguished Scholarship: \$16,000 over four years

*TXST is conducting academic reviews of students without SAT or ACT scores for possible merit scholarship awards.

National Scholarships

These scholarships are awarded automatically based on qualifications that you may have earned in high school: being named a National Merit Finalist or a National Hispanic Scholar as well as meeting certain high school rank and SAT/ACT test score minimums.

Example:

National Distinction Scholarship For National Merit Finalists:

\$40,000 total over 4 years

National Hispanic Scholarship: \$8,000 total over 4 years

Terry Foundation Scholarship

The Terry Foundation awards full-ride scholarships, renewable up to four years, to incoming freshmen from Texas.



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Texas State's Annual Security Reports and Fire Safety Report
